STREET ART STROLLS HEADINGLEY

SOUTH HEADINGLEY is an Art Gallery!

The streets of South Headingley are full of art works.



From Headingley Town Centre, travel down Cardigan Road, and turn left into Victoria Road. A hundred yards along on the left, there's a **wall painting** (now half-obscured and deteriorating). From here, turn right into Norwood Road, then left into Norwood Mount, where **Recycle Engineering** has been painted by Olas Art. At the end of the street, turn right into Norwood Grove, then turn right again into Cardigan Lane – where there's a house-high **mural** of Rob Burrow by Reggie Challenger [pictured].

Continue along Cardigan Lane, back to Cardigan Road. Turn left, along to Walmsley Road, where there are **paintings** by James Archer on the side walls of Provision Properties and Cardigan Laundrette [pictured]. Further on, on the other side of the road, spot a longship **painting** in Back Ashville Grove.





Continue along Cardigan Road, and turn left into Brudenell Road. At Mayville Road, turn left again, and on the left, there's a mural by Niall Unger. Turn back and cross Brudenell Road, down Thornville Road (beside the mosque), to Royal Park Road. Turn left up the road to see on the right, a wonderful series of endterrace paintings, along the Thornvilles, by Emily Jayne Kaan [pictured], Imogen Joyce, Ellie Windwood, Rob Cook and Nicky Lines & Dean Wood. At the end, in Thornville Street, is another mural.

Further up the road, turn left into Queen's Road, and pass the **shutters** of Pitza Cano on the left. At Brudenell Road, by the Hyde Park Picture House, turn right, and after some 25 yards, turn right into the end of Brudenell Mount, where there's a **picture** of the Statue of Liberty on the left. Return and continue along Brudenell Road; notice a decoratively painted terrace **house** on the right (now a little faded). Continue to the junction with Welton Road on the left, where a **mural** advertises Dragon Tattoo studio. Turn down



Welton Road, to find a **mural** on the right by Fem Sorcell [pictured], just before Chestnut Avenue. Turn left, and at the junction of the Avenue with Brudenell Road, and spot a **painting** of two famous children's characters on the right.

Cross Brudenell Road and return along Queen's Road, back to Royal Park Road. Turn left up the Road, passing the painted **railings** of the former Royal Park School (now under development as Royal



Park). Further up the Road, on the right, is an end-terrace mural by Charlotte Brown [pictured]. And at the top of the Road, at the junction with Hyde Park Road, see another mural, by Emma Hardaker. Turn left, and then turn left again, down Brudenell Street, for another mural on the right, by Joy Rooney. Turn right into Royal Park Terrace, for an anonymous mural on the right. Continue along Royal Park Terrace, turn left down Brudenell Avenue, and then right into Royal Park Grove. At the end, at the junction with Brudenell Road, is a group of paintings on the left by Maya Cross Odemudia [pictured below].

Turn right up Brudenell Road again, at the top turn left along Hyde Park Road, then left into the back streets, down Kensington Terrace, and then right into Midland Road. Turn left into Back Kensington Terrace, and then right into Back Midland Road – where you will find no less than three **murals**, two straight away on the right, and then a third at the end on the left. Turn left into Hyde Park Terrace, which turns right, becoming Ebberston Grove. At the end, at the junction with Victoria Road, on the left, is a **painting** on the side of Franco's Pitza. Another **painting** is round the corner to the left, on the front of the building. Turn right up Victoria Road, to Hyde Park Corner, and turn right into Hyde Park Road: ahead is a whole end-terrace **portrayal** of Marcelo Bielsa by Irek Jasutowicz [pictured], and opposite, another **painting** on the side of Go Cut barber shop.
